From conception to completion, NOAA has been committed to constructing a new Western Regional Center as a complement to its natural surroundings. The installment of five new public artworks by nationally important artists represents cooperation between NOAA's architects and engineers, the Seattle Arts Commission, the National Endowment for the Arts, the public, and the artists themselves. This spirit of working together has resulted in a site for NOAA's new Center that is more than simply a home for the administrative, technical, and research activities of NOAA. It is also a refuge for the wildlife on the shores of Lake Washington, and a park-like setting in which visitors are invited to share in the experience of these five unique works.
